Spoken by 68 million people in the world, Italian is the only official language of two countries (Italy and...can you guess the second one? The answer is at the end of this passage!) and one of the official languages of the European Union, the Vatican, and Switzerland.

As we have mentioned before, from a linguistic perspective Italian is a neo-Latin known as romance language, and its history is intertwined with poetry and literature. We owe to Dante Alighieri and his Divina Commedia - written in his native Florentine language - the standardisation of Italian, which soon became the commonly spoken language among educated

people all over the not-yet-become country.

Despite its <u>celebrity</u>, Italian is not the only language spoken in Italy. Commissario Montalbano saga.
